



Canary (PreK)

GOALS

The items on the following list are just some of the skills that the **Canary** teachers will be working on with your child. These skills are based on The Connecticut State Preschool Performance Standards.

Personal and Social Skills

- Independently selecting and participating in a wide variety of activities
- Persisting with both self-selected and teacher-selected tasks until completion
- Actively participating in whole-group activities
- Anticipating transitions and following routines and rules independently
- Identifying feelings and using words to express them independently
- Sustaining cooperative activities with many individuals
- Using appropriate strategies to resolve conflicts
- Demonstrating respect for differences among peers

Physical Skills

- Coordinating complex movements with increased balance, control and accuracy
- Using opposing hand movements to manipulate materials such as paper and scissors
- Independently eating, dressing and toileting

Cognitive Skills

- Describing, predicting and planning for purposeful exploration and observation
- Creating and using alternative strategies to solve problems independently
- Creating and describing complex patterns
- Verbally comparing and ordering objects based on non-visible attributes
- Counting 20 objects and identifying groups of objects with more, less or the same
- Understanding positional concepts like “above,” “below,” “next to,” and “in between”
- Understanding and participating in conversations using a series of related sentences
- Understanding characters, sequence of events and how print is read
- Using knowledge of sounds and letters to identify some printed words
- Writing messages using invented spelling and several conventional words

Creative Skills

- Creating elaborate constructions that represent own ideas, thoughts or experiences
- Representing own ideas, thoughts or experiences with artistic mediums
- Engaging in extended, planned, cooperative play with peers
- Adjusting singing and movements in response to changes in pitch and rhythm
