We are excited to launch plans for Week 2. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

Language Development

Reading Books


Sit with your toddler to read books. Bring your child's attention to the illustrations in the book. Talk to them about the new vocabulary in the story and point out the pictures to match the words.



Social-Emotional Development

Turn Taking

Work together with your toddler to build buildings and structures. Talk to your toddler about whose turn it is to add a block. This will encourage turn taking with your toddler.



Physical Literacy

Follow the Leader

Play follow the leader with your toddler. Encourage them to run, jump, climb and move their body. Practice throwing and kicking a ball with your toddler.



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Cognitive Development

Puzzles

Provide your toddler with easy puzzles that only have a few pieces that they can do. Encourage your toddler to put the puzzle together matching the pieces.

Creative Activity

Crayon Exploration

Give your toddler crayons and paper that they can explore with. Encourage them to make lines on the paper. Bring your toddlers attention to the lines that they draw.



Additional Activities

Porridge Playdough: Make porridge playdough using 2 cups of flour, 1 cup of salt, 2 cups of oats, 2 tablespoons of oil and 2 cups of water. Mix together. Provide your toddler with cookie cutters to use with their playdough.

Spider Web: Make a spider web basket using a laundry basket and yarn. Add objects to the bin and have your child reach for the different items.

Get Outside: Get outside to get some fresh air. Take a walk with your toddler and point out the changes that are happening. Point out the animals and birds that they may see.
