

LEARNING AT HOME SCHOOL AGE WEEK 10

Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 10. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

STEAM

Science, Technology, Engineering, Art
and Mathematics

Science Experiment

Ice Excavation

Freeze small manipulative toys into ice cubes or a plastic cup of water. Once they have turned to ice, take them out of the tray or cup. Give your child salt water that they can use with a eye dropper or turkey baster to melt the ice. Add food coloring to the salt water to show what the salt water does to the ice.

Wind Pipes

Using a variety of colored straws, have your child line them up in a pattern. Tape them together, making sure the top of the straws all line up evenly. Cut the straws diagonally from down to up. Have your child breath/blow through the top of the straws, attempting to make different sounds and whistles.



Physical Literacy

Target Throw

Set up a tarp to look similar to the photo. (Can use a sheet or posterboard) Using various balls, have a starting point from where your child will attempt to throw the ball through different openings. Make it a competition for the family and add points up.

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Sensory

Confetti Bottles

Make confetti bottles with your child using glitter, sequins, water, food coloring, and oil. Seal the top of the bottle with hot glue or super glue when finished to assure the top stays tight.



Creative Activity

Marble Painting

Place a piece of paper within a moderate/ deep cardboard box or tray. Dip marbles into various colors of paint. Add the marbles to the box and let your child roll the marbles back and forth creating a design on their paper.



Additional Activities

Alphabet Search: Have your child search the house or outside for items that start with different letters of the alphabet. Challenge them to find one item for every letter.

Lazer Maze: Using toilet paper, yarn, string or any other object you have that will work. Tape up your string material between the walls creating a maze for your child to get through.

Pen Pal: Have your child choose someone from school that they would like to write to. Encourage them to write letters to their friends and be pen pals.
