

# LEARNING AT HOME OLDER TODDLER WEEK 11

June 1st-5th




Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 11. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

## Language Development

### Street Signs

Talk with your child about the street signs that they see when they are in the car. What do those signs mean? Take a walk around your neighbor hood and point out the road signs in your neighborhood.



## Social-Emotional Development

### Emotion Charades

Draw pictures of different emotion faces. Fold the pictures and put them in a bucket. Take turns with your toddler and pick out a paper. Act out that emotion and guess what the other is doing.



## Physical Literacy

### Red Light Green Light

Give your child a paper plate steering wheel and encourage them to drive around the playground to the game red light, green light. Use a green and red circle as a visual for your child.

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## Cognitive Development

### Number Identification Roads

Provide roads in the shape of a number for your child to drive their toy cars on. While your child is playing, help them identify the number. You can use construction paper, tape or felt to make your number roads.



## Creative Activity

### Marker Car Exploration

Tape markers, tips down, too the back of the cars so that your child can drive the cars over large paper and make marks on the paper. You can do this activity with crayons or colored pencils if you do not have markers.



## Additional Activities

**Ramps:** Make cardboard ramps for your child to use and drive their cars down. Encourage them to use different types of cars to see which one will go farther.

**Airplanes:** Take to your child about how planes get around in the sky. Have them put their arms out and use their “wings” to fly around the yard.

**Transportation Books:** Read transportation books with your child. Talk about the types of transportation they see in the book.
