

# LEARNING AT HOME YOUNG TODDLER WEEK 11

June 1st-5th



Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 11. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

## Language Development

### Picture Wall

Create a picture wall with your child using a variety of pictures. You can add pictures of your family or have a theme such as animals or transportation. Put the picture wall at your child's level and talk to them about the pictures using familiar and new words.



## Social-Emotional Development

### Car Turn Taking

Make roads that your child can pretend to drive their cars on. You can use felt, paper or tape to make roads. If you have a large box, draw roads and a town in the box and add blocks and cars for your child to explore. Take turns with your toddler using the words "My turn, your turn".



## Physical Literacy

### Ball Boogie

Hang a light-weight ball or balloon from the ceiling at your child's level with string. Call out different body parts for your toddler to hit the ball with. If they need help identifying their body parts, help them by modeling the body part.

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## Cognitive Development

### Hide and Seek

Show your toddler an object. Hide the object in another room with part of it showing. Have your toddler go and find that object. You can help them by offering them hints to where the object is. Once they find it, pick another object to hide. You can also hide yourself for older toddlers to find. Once they find you, have them try to hide.

## Creative Activity

### Wheel Prints

Use a large round object dipped in paint or the children to press on paper. Large round items you might have around your house such as Pringles top or can, ball, paper towel tube, large buttons and old CDs.



## Additional Activities

Cardboard Box Train or Car: Paint a cardboard box and add features of a car or train. Let your toddler play with the train or car and pretend that they are traveling.

Toy Boats in the Water table: Add numbers to the bottom of the boats. As your toddler plays with the boats, identify and show them the numbers at the bottom and count the boats in the sensory bin out loud.

Outside: Take a walk with your toddler using their different types of transportation they have. You can use a bike, wagon, stroller or walk with your feet. Bring attention to the different types of transportation you see in your neighborhood.
