

LEARNING AT HOME YOUNG TODDLER WEEK 8

May 11th-15th



Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 8. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

Language Development

Garden Safety

Take a walk around the garden with your toddler. If you do not have a garden, talk a walk around and point out different plants. Talk about being safe in a garden and how we can not eat plants or put anything in our mouth. This is a great time to talk about hand washing as well.



Social-Emotional Development

Emotion Eggs

Add different emotion faces to plastic eggs. Take them apart and let your toddler put the eggs back together making different emotion faces. Talk about what emotion the face means when they put it together.



Physical Literacy

Dance Party

Play music and have a dance party with your toddler. Let them show off their dance moves by shaking, swaying and rocking back and forth to the music.

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Cognitive Development

Nature Color Sorting

Let your toddler collect different nature items that can be painted different colors. After the items are dry, have your child sort the items by color. Talk to them about what colors they are sorting.



Creative Activity

Finger Painting with Colorful Paints

Provide your child with colorful finger paints. Let your child explore with the paints mixing colors to make new colors and painting on paper.

Homemade Finger Paint

Mix together 1 cup water and 1 cup flour until it turns into a paste. Divide the paste up and mix in food coloring to make colors.



Additional Activities

Sensory: Worm Sensory- Mix together food coloring, cornstarch and water to make a oobleck. Add yarn worms to the oobleck for exploration.

Painting with flowers: Let your toddler use paint and flowers (real or fake) to create art.

Crayon Exploration: Help your toddler learn to hold a crayon and make marks on the paper.
