

LEARNING AT HOME YOUNG TODDLER WEEK 9

May 18th-22nd



Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 9. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

Language Development

Old MacDonald

Sing the song Old MacDonald with your toddler. Use props such as pictures of animals or stuffed animals to represent the animals in the song. Help your toddler name the animals and learn the animal sounds.



Social-Emotional Development

Farmer

With your toddler, pretend to be farmers on a farm. Set up areas where they can pretend to get eggs from a chicken coop (box with eggs in it), milk the cow (glove filled with water) and even garden.



Physical Literacy

Farm Animal Action Game

Make cards that have actions of different farm animals. Let your toddler pick a card and do the action on the card.

Card Ideas: Roll like a pig, gallop like a horse, peck like a chicken, strut like a rooster, walk like a cow, waddle like a duck

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Cognitive Development

Farm Animal Picture Puzzles

Cut pictures of farm animals into 2 or 4 pieces. Let your toddler try to put the picture together to create the animal. You can add the picture to Popsicle sticks to make puzzles.



Creative Activity

Painting with Animals

Let your toddler use animals to make marks on paper. Bring their attention to the colors that they are using.

pudding Paint

Vanilla Pudding

Food Coloring

Make the vanilla pudding and divide to make different colors. Add food coloring then paint.



Additional Activities

Farm Animal Search: Hide farm animals outside or around your house. Have your infant search for the animals and collect them all. You can use pictures, stuffed animals or toy animals.

Sensory: Add rubber ducks to a small tray of water and let your toddler explore with the ducks.

Paint a barn: Make a barn with your toddler using a large cardboard box (or small box for their toy animals). Let your toddler paint the box and when it is dry they can use it to pretend to be farm animals.
