

# LEARNING AT HOME OLDER PRESCHOOLER WEEK 12

June 8th-12th



Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 12. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

## Language Development

### Transportation Rhyming

With your child, come up with words that rhyme with different types of transportation vehicles (ex. Train-Rain, Boat-Goat). See how many rhyming words you can come up with for each type of vehicle.



## Social-Emotional Development

### Listening Walk

When taking a walk with your child, have them listen to the sounds that they hear. Have them describe what they are hearing and guess what they think it is.



## Physical Literacy

### Airplane Cloud Jumping

Draw clouds with numbers or letters in them on your driveway or make clouds out of construction paper. Call out a number or letter and have your child fly like a plane over to it and jump on it. If you are using numbers, have your child jump the number on the cloud (number 5= jump 5 times).

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## Cognitive Development

### Build and Test Bridge Construction

Using multiple materials (blocks, legos, construction paper, popsicle sticks), have your child draw out their construction plans to build a bridge. Have them build their bridge and test the strength with toy cars. If their bridge stays, have them test the weight limit by adding heavier items. Plan and build more designs to figure out what design can hold the most weight.



## Creative Activity

### Stamping with Nuts, Bolts, and Screws

Provide Nuts, Bolts, and Screws, ink pads or paint, and construction paper. Let your child use the Nuts, Bolts, and Screws to make prints on their paper.



## Additional Activities

**Demolition Station:** Have your child build with recycled materials. When they are done, try knocking them over with “cranes” (balls).

**Dump Trucks in the Sand:** Add lettered rocks, moldable dough and trucks to a sensory bin. Encourage your child to build and spell out words and their names with the lettered rocks. Make moldable dough using 2 cups flour and 1/4 cup oil (double if you have a bigger bin).

**Construction Worker Orchestra:** Using blocks and toy tools, let your child make music using the construction materials.
