Dear Families,

We are excited to launch plans for Week 7. There are some great options for physical activities in an indoor environment. Additionally, some simple ideas with materials available at home to support the creative undertakings. We hope you enjoy this week's plan with your little ones!

Language Development

Hide and Seek Polar Animals

Hide pictures of polar animals around your house or yard. Encourage your child to walk around and find the different polar animals in your house. Encourage the child to name the polar animal. If they cannot name the animal, introduce them to the new vocabulary.



Social-Emotional Development

Block Igloo

Pull out the blocks and work together with your child to build an igloo for their animals. Encourage teamwork with your child and model manners.



Physical Literacy

Fish Races

Set up a relay race for your child using fish. Encourage your child to bring the fish from one side of the room to the other (or outside if you can).

Cognitive Development

Feed the Penguin

Make a penguin with your child using a recycled box or container. Provide your child with the penguin, number fish (paper fish with numbers on them) and tweezers. Let your child feed the penguin the fish using the tweezers. Work on number recognition by talking about the numbers they are feeding the penguin.

Creative Activity

Penguin Collages

Provide your child with black and white art materials. Let your child make a collage using the items. Suggested Art Materials: Paper, felt, feathers, foam sheets, pipe cleaners, colored popsicle sticks.



Additional Activities

Polar Animal Puzzles: Provide your child with pictures of polar animals that are cut in half to make puzzles. Encourage your toddler to make the puzzle pieces together to make the picture. If 2-piece puzzles are easy for your child, cut the picture into 4 or 6 pieces.

Waddle like a penguin: Show your child how to waddle around like a penguin. Put on music for your child and encourage them to waddle around until the music stops.

Penguin Search: Talk to your child about how penguins are black and white. Encourage your child to search for items around your house that are black and white like penguins.
